

Peer Helpers Participate in Anti-Bullying Summit

January 17, 2012 – The Jennifer Claire Moore Foundation, in partnership with Baldwin County Public Schools, will present an anti-bullying program for high school students, “Schools Where Everyone Belongs: Research, Programs, and Policy Designed to Reduce Bullying,” January 20 – 22 at Camp Beckwith in Fairhope. The roster of speakers will include Dr. Patti Agatston, a counselor/consultant at Cobb County Schools’ Prevention/Intervention Center in Marietta, GA (metro Atlanta) and a nationally recognized expert on cyberbullying.

The summit will be attended by 34 students who participate in the Jennifer Claire Moore Foundation’s Peer Helper program at their respective Baldwin County high schools. Following the speakers’ presentations, students will produce anti-bullying video skits to present to their feeder pattern schools. The summit’s speakers will be taped and their presentations will be available on the websites of Baldwin County Public Schools and the Jennifer Claire Moore Foundation, along with the student videos. The collective bullying prevention information will serve as a resource for students, parents, grandparents, teachers and counselors.
